Order these from the least value to highest value. Add small amounts together.</p> <p><b>Go on a shape hunt. What 3d shapes can you see?</b></p> <p><b>You can draw and label these.</b></p> <p>(Maths)</p>	<p><b>Materials</b> In Science we are learning about everyday materials.</p> <p>Can you find any objects that are made from these materials?</p> <p>Paper, metal, glass, fabric, brick, rock, plastic, elastic, foil.</p> <p>You can draw these into your book and label them.</p> <p>Can you describe any of them?</p> <p><b>Useful words:</b> Transparent (see through), opaque (cannot see through it), soft, stretchy, shiny, absorbent, rough, smooth, bendy, dull, bright, hard.</p> <p><b>Other words:</b> man-made natural (Science)</p>
<p><b>Explorers</b> Can you become an explorer? Go outside and explore your environment. What can you see, hear, smell, feel?</p> <p>Can you find some interesting objects?</p> <p><b>Extra:</b> Can you find out about one of these explorers? <b>Captain James Cook</b> <b>Neil Armstrong</b> <b>Extra:</b> <b>Christopher Columbus</b> <b>Scott of the Antarctic</b> (History)</p>	<p><b>DT</b> In DT we are making puppets.</p> <p>Can you make your own puppet? This could be a favourite book character or a fairy tale character.</p> <p>You can use any materials e.g. paper, card, fabric, lollypop sticks...</p>	<p><b>Extra activity</b> Practise tying shoelaces</p>
