

Homework – Autumn 2

<p>Write about something you have learnt about in year 2. Think carefully about your handwriting (letter size and formation)! (English)</p>	<p>Make a repeating pattern using objects at home (toy cars, leaves, pencils, etc.). Challenge: See if you can find a repeating pattern in the environment. Take photographs of what you find. (Maths)</p>	<p>Find objects in your house that contain batteries. Challenge: What happens if you leave one of these items (e.g., a torch) switched on? (Science)</p>
<p>Use a device you have at home to take photographs of an object from different angles (e.g., close-up). Challenge: Take a photograph of a 2D shape and a 3D shape. Do you know their names? (Computing)</p>	<p>Find out why Florence Nightingale was called the Lady with the Lamp. (History)</p>	<p>Listen to a piece of music and have a go at clapping the rhythm. Challenge: What instruments can you hear? (Music)</p>
<p>Design a poster to show how to keep safe at home. Here are some ideas for rules you could include: - Put toys away so nobody trips over them. - Wipe up spills so nobody slips. (PSHE)</p>	<p>Invent a game where you have to pass an object to another person. Think about the different ways you can pass things using different parts of your body. (PE)</p>	<p>Draw an analogue clock with the current time on. How many minutes past the hour is it? How many minutes until the next hour? Challenge: Do this at five different times during the day. (Maths)</p>

Every half term, your child will receive a homework matrix with activities that are linked to what we cover in school. We ask that one task is completed per week and that you initial and date each activity completed. Evidence of homework can be glued into children's books, photographs tweeted or emailed to us, or items can even be brought into school! We will collect homework books in on a Wednesday morning.

In addition to this, we would also like all children to do the following things weekly:

- Read a minimum of three times to a grown-up/older sibling (please record this in reading records)
- Spend time on TTRockstars/NumBots
- Practise common exception spellings (these are in the back of homework books)

All passwords can be found in children's reading records.

There may sometimes be an additional, optional reinforcement activity sent home in homework books for children to have a go at.
