	William Morris was born in England on 24th March, 1834	
	● He died in 1896	
	He became a poet, artist and manufacturer	
	He made stained glass windows wallpaper and tapestries	
	<ul> <li>He was inspired by plants and flowers</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>His designs had floral patterns using block printing to repeat these designs</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>These were then made and repeated using printing machines</li> </ul>	
Mono- printing	Use mono-printing to create a print inspired by nature (plants) or even using plants/natural objects	
Impressed printing	Use a printing block (potato) to print an image

	Key Vocabulary
printing	Transferring images onto different surfaces
Impressed printing	When the printing block is created by carving out the surface.
Mono-printing	This method of printing is to make unique prints. Draw patterns, shapes and designs directly onto an inked surface, usually an acrylic sheet. Gently lay a piece of paper on top of the inked surface to pick up the design.
Other words linked to printing:	Press, roll, design, effect, print, layer, techniques
