Key Vocabulary		
printing	Transferring images onto different surfaces	
Relief printing	relief printing, in art printmaking, a process consisting of cutting or etching a printing surface in such a way that all that remains of the original surface is the design to be printed. Examples of relief-printing processes include woodcut, anastatic printing (also called relief etching), linocut, and metal cut.	
Mono-printing	This method of printing is to make unique prints. Draw patterns, shapes and designs directly onto an inked surface, usually an acrylic sheet. Gently lay a piece of paper on top of the inked surface to pick up the design.	
Impressionist art	What is Impressionism? Impressionism describes a style of painting developed in France during the mid-to-late 19th century; characterizations of the style include small, visible brushstrokes that offer the bare impression of form, unblended colour and an emphasis on the accurate depiction of natural light.	
Other words linked to printing:	Press, roll, design, effect, print, layer, techniques
