

Key vocabulary

Reef knot: Making two ends, pass the right end over the left and then pull. Next, pass the left over the right and pull again. This is a good binding knot, as it can be used to join two pieces of rope together or secure the rope around an object.

Square (Reef) Knot Instructions



Lashings – a lashing is used to bind two things together. Use lashings to build simple structures like a tripod or a flagpole. Sticks and lashings can be used to build complex structures with trestle triangles, like a tower or a shelter.
