# Key knowledge I need to understand


The House of Wisdom was a library and research facility which collected and translated writing from many cultures, including Persian, Indian, ancient Greek and Roman texts. By AD 900, the House of Wisdom stored more books than anywhere else in the world and was attracting the most brilliant minds to study there.

Islamic art includes architecture, calligraphy, painted glass, illustrated patterns, pottery, and textile arts

A caliph is the leader of a caliphate - a political-religious form of government of a Muslim community.

A caliph had to be Muslim, male, sane, fair, just and law-abiding

The Silk Road is a network of trade routes linking China to the Middle East and Europe, first used to carry Chinese silk.
