## Group Leader

The forest school leader is responsible for the safe running of forest schools conducting daily site risk assessments. Any permanent amendments or changes will be reported to the appointed person as a duty of care. In the event of equipment/ resource or environmental damage due to weather conditions the forest leader will promptly remove any hazards. If necessary areas will be sectioned off using rope or clearly identifiable yellow and black hazard tape, this will be conducted with caution. Assessments will also be reviewed in the event of an accident. Before carrying out any activity on or off site all staff involved are made aware of activity plans (adapted if needed for individual needs-SEN) and risk assessments (name and signature-for offsite trips) associated with the activities.

Activities, tool use and equipment are individually risk assessed (refer to risk assessments for full list) —any hazards associated with an activity, that are at risk of causing harm will be considered and suitable control measures taken to control and minimise the risk.
