But now our time together is done.*

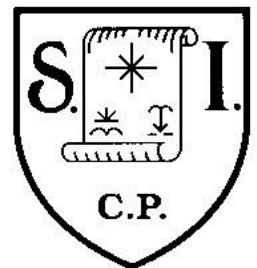
*Finishing primary school, we face the unknown,
